We are still awaiting final numbers but we estimate we took in around \$5,000 in the 3rd annual event.


Honored Birthdays

Rotary Scholar Returns to Help Homeless




About 4 years ago, our District invested in a young woman as our first Global Grant Scholar! Liz Powers completed a graduate degree while working to encourage impoverished women and immigrants in Scotland. Liz returned home and spoke to our club in early 2013. Liz and her brother recently began a non-profit, ArtLifting and she was just featured in Rotary International's online blog! "Working with homeless artists as a Rotary Scholar was revolutionary for my growth as a social entrepreneur. In December of 2013, my brother Spencer Powers and I founded ArtLifting, an art gallery that features the work of homeless and disabled artists. By being on the ArtLifting platform, artists are emotionally empowered and have an opportunity to earn a stable income. ArtLifting's impact has been featured in the Boston Globe, Bloomberg Businessweek (online), ABC local

news, and the Huffington Post. Our mission is inspired by Rotary's mission of Service Above Self." What a great example of our Foundation dollars making a long-term impact back home.

Speaker Feature: Robert Steele

Earlier this month we welcomed Bob Steele, Author of The <u>Curse</u>: <u>Big-Time Gambling's Seduction of a Small New England Town</u>. Bob's presentation focused on the history of Reservation-based casinos including Fox Woods and Mohegan Sun. He introduced to us the long-term effects he has witnessed in the areas of suicide, embezzlement, and addiction as a resident of Connecticut. Bob served in the CIA and Congress, and was a nominee for Governor of his home state. Driving much conversation within our club, his history presentation was surely relevant as Massachusetts decides on the fate of casinos here at home.
