Reported by Suzanne Bowering from July 22nd meeting, 11am. Present were: Bruce Donovan, Suzanne Bowering, Ed Harding, Barb Worley and Bob Kimball.

The secretary's report was submitted electronically last month. The Treasurers report was read, with a few questions. K9 fund has \$3734.35. Regarding the Bob Crawford account. We paid out \$500 in June, that amount should be reduced to \$2500. We have paid for the CPA grand piano,



the dolly to move it and the cover. We are approx. \$1k under budget. Suzanne has approved the verbiage for the sign that will go on the piano. We will have a photo op once the sign is there. Boys & Girls Club computer status: 4 more computers and "stuff' to go with them have been purchased and installed. We donated \$2k, total cost came to \$1,900. Pedaling for a Purpose with Rotarian Keith Harris

At the tender age of 50, he's set out on an eight-week, 4,400-mile bike ride across the U.S. to raise \$25,000 for The Rotary Foundation. He's also hoping to raise an additional \$2,500 for Anna Jaques Hospital in Newburyport where a few years ago he was treated for a life-threatening heart condition. "The trip is sort of my midlife crisis," he admits but it's not the first time he's pedaled across the country. He made the trek about 20 years ago, before he married his wife, Christina. Harris has been a Rotary member for 18 years. He's served as president for the Rotary Club of Ipswich, Massachusetts, and as a district Rotary Foundation chair for seven years. He says Rotary has become "a way of life" for him and for Christina, who's also a member. "Rotary



is indeed a body of many parts," says Harris. "It allows us to reach out through the headlines and interact with the people we otherwise would only hear or read about." He'll have plenty of interactions during the trip this summer. He says he's planning to occasionally stay with other Rotary members along the way, as well as tap into the hospitality of the WarmShowers.org community for cyclists. His trip began 9 June in Seattle where he dipped his rear wheel into the Pacific, and he hopes to finish in Newburyport on 9 August by dipping his front tire into the Atlantic. "Hopefully I will meet new people and by doing something unusual, have new opportunities to encourage them to do what I believe they already want to do deep down," he says. Dominican Project Update

It's been almost a year since our Rotarians Lisa Roderick and Suzanne Bowering visited la Escuela Cajuil in the Dominican Republic to deliver our donated supplies. Our club also made a \$300 donation to the school to purchased a file cabinet. Recently, Amy received some correspondence from our friend Paul Tierney of the Rotary Club of Punta Cana Bavaro. Here's what he had to said:



"We are coasting along as far as the school is concerned. There is a small increase of students. It is being used to provide a literacy program for illiterate adults, a three month 2-3 day evening schooling to teach basic reading and writing to illiterate adults. It is also being used on weekends to teach English. It has become a community meeting house for the neighborhood council. We have made some large donation deliveries there of clothing and school supplies from outside groups on May 30th. Every kid got something to wear, new footwear. There is no update as far as the water situation for the school is concerned as we are

brainstorming ideas about how to incorporate a water supply to the school if we proceed with constructing a health clinic that will definitely need a source of water. We have been scouting out nearby land. Yet, nobody is interested in donating land or selling at a reasonable price, the first obstacles needed to be overcome before the spade makes the first turn of the earth. We had a bingo night June 27^{th} to begin to raise funds for the proposed clinic and this coming Saturday there will be a golf tournament at the Punta Cana Resort to do same. (Teacher) Damaris did finish her classes of last summer and fall but she still needs to complete more semesters of class work to obtain a degree. It is difficult for her to do this because the university is in Santo Domingo and classes are on the weekend. It involves 3-4 hours travel one-way and a one night stay over in the big city. We surmised to keep the proposed medical clinic simple with 3-4 modest rooms with three to four beds to be staffed by an intern doctor on the public health payroll. Public health requires they do duty in the rural areas. The club will assist with med donations and furnishings. It is a major project but I expect we can get over the first hurdles."



Polio Goal Set Early

After our record setting \$20k polio donation this past year, our club will be called upon again to participate in raising awareness and funds for polio eradication. President Bob has set his goal at \$25k this year! We'll be kicking off the official campaign in October but are now looking for members, friends and family to join our plunge team. 
